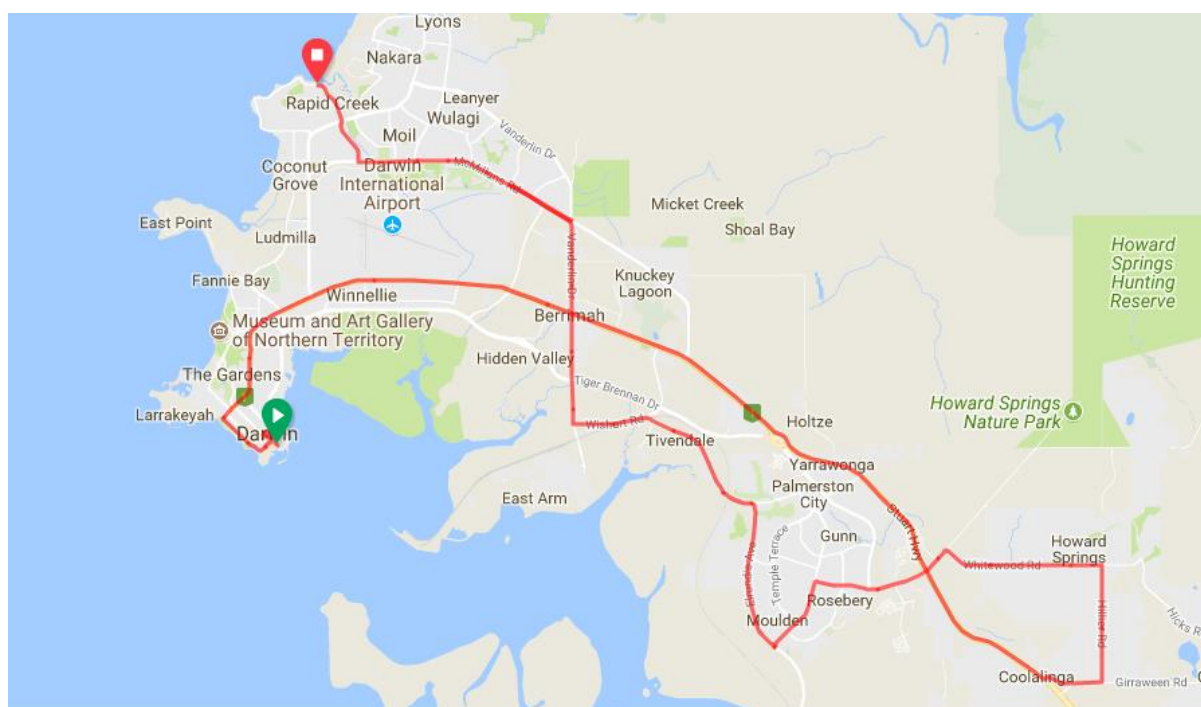

Velodrome Boost on Track for Cyclists and Jobs

28 June 2018

Darwin's cycling community will be able to enjoy track cycling again, with the Territory Labor Government providing an additional \$1 million to upgrade the ageing velodrome facility at Bagot Oval.

Minister for Tourism and Culture, Lauren Moss said the additional funding was on top of a one-off capital grant of \$1.5 million that was given to Council in 2015 to upgrade the velodrome track, including lighting. "The Territory Labor Government is working closely with local governments to deliver safe, fun and inclusive facilities for all Territorians to improve their health and wellbeing and allow them to reach their sporting potential," Ms Moss said.

"The previous CLP Government provided funding for the velodrome but in their usual chaotic style, failed to actually consult the cycling community about what they needed, so left the project with a funding shortfall. "We have listened to Cycling NT and we are providing an additional \$1 million to make sure the project budget for the upgrade is sufficient to meet the needs of our cycling community.

"This project has been stalled too long. Council can now get on with the works which will stimulate the local economy and create local jobs during construction."

Local Member for Johnston, Ken Vowles said the velodrome would be a valuable addition to his electorate. "I have supported this project for a long time, as well as the installation of lights at Bagot Oval, because anything that encourages increased participation in sport is good for our community," Mr Vowles said. "To see both these projects going ahead thanks to NT Government funding is great news for sport in the Territory."

Stuart Crompton, Darwin Cycling Club President welcomed the additional funding.

"This additional funding from the NT Government will ensure that the Darwin Cycling Club can develop the sport of track cycling, which has been largely missing from the Darwin Community since the 90's," Mr Crompton said.

"The velodrome in its current state and configuration does not support the development of track cycling here in Darwin. This additional funding will ensure that we have a track that is not only safe to ride on, but also gives our members the opportunity to reach their potential, whatever level they are."

Paul Mead, Cycling NT Consultant said the upgrades will provide an excellent facility for not only cyclists, but also for the community.

"Research shows that people in Darwin already ride their bikes more than those in other States and Territories. This additional funding will provide another excellent cycling facility for the Community that is fit for purpose for the sport of track cycling, as well as supporting other community user groups needs," Mr Mead said.

"Cycling NT thanks the NT Government for listening to us and ensuring that an appropriate level of funding is provided so that this important piece of community infrastructure is delivered."
